



Student Code of Conduct

In order to create an environment conducive to learning we want to ensure we give you all the support and guidance you need to achieve success. The Code of Conduct is a guide to highlight what we expect from students so we can help you to achieve success in a supportive and non-threatening environment.

As a student at Recovery College East we expect you to:

1. Treat everyone with compassion, dignity and respect. Any form of bullying is taken seriously and may lead to a student being excluded from the college
2. Avoid offensive, racist or sexist language at all times and not discriminate against or harass other students or staff
3. Dress appropriately for a learning environment, and not wear logos or slogans that could be deemed offensive to others
4. Be respectful of other students' rights, life choices, beliefs and opinions
5. Respect confidentiality: any personal information shared within the college environment is not to be referred to or shared elsewhere
6. Respect the wellbeing and property of the other members of the college and report any health and safety concerns to college staff
7. Use the library and internet, where available, in a responsible manner
8. Take an active part in your own learning and use the resources made available to you
9. Provide us with the information we need to support your enrolment and ongoing learning
10. Refrain from using mobile phones during the courses

12. Take responsibility for your own learning and come to the courses equipped to participate
13. Advise us of things that may be preventing you from getting the most from your learning experience
